



Dignity and Privacy

Learning summary

This learning covers the principles and importance of privacy which can be defined as 'giving space to someone when and where they need it' or 'treating personal information confidentially'. This learning enables learners to increase their skills in providing dignity within the clinical setting. Dignity can be defined as 'focusing on the value of every individual, including respecting their views, choices and decisions', 'not making assumptions about how they want to be treated', 'working with care and compassion' between 'communicating directly with the individual whenever possible.'

Learning aims

The aim of this learning is to increase awareness and understanding of privacy and dignity in care provision. It will enrich approaches at the point of care, for patient's who are cared for by clinical and care staff.

Learning objectives

Learners will be able to:

- Describe dignity and privacy in care provision
- Explain roles and responsibilities in providing privacy and dignity within care
- Explain how they will take learning from this session forward into the workplace, to build on current practice and teach other team members the expected standards
